Man faces other charges

surveillance on him following the abductions.

Police also checked into the possibility of cult activity involving the three men, but found no evidence.

The fugitive is held in the Lake County (Ill.) Jail, on a fugitive bond of \$100,000.

He was arrested Monday morning in Mundelein, Ill., about 50 miles north of Chicago. Officials would not say if he lives there, nor would they explain the \$100,000 bond.

A June 22 Greene County warrant placed a \$10,000 bond on him for the vandalism charge.

Citing Missouri statute, police would not discuss information on the apparent vandals.

of Streeter, who gave police a statement regarding the vandalism.

The fugitive was believed to be in town when the three disappeared from Levitt's home at 1717 E. Delmar St. He is the last of three to five people police originally considered of interest in the case. Others have been ruled out as suspects.

"Our real interest in this guy is to eliminate him as being in any way associated with the disappearances of the three women," Capt. Tony Glenn said.

"We have no interest in the vandalism case at all in regards to this investigation."

The former boyfriend, 20, apparently sold the gold fillings for \$30 at a Springfield pawn shop. A Crime Stoppers tip led to the three arrests in early March.

Police sources say investigators extensively questioned the former boyfriend and conducted up to 48 hours of

The man Springfield police want to question in connection with the June 7 disappearance of three women is charged with breaking into a mausoleum and two coffins in February.

The 21-year-old man is jailed in Illinois awaiting extradition to Springfield on a fugitive warrant for the vandalism. He and two others — charged with felony institutional vandalism — apparently stole fillings from the teeth of a corpse at Maple Park Cemetery.

Police doubt any of the three had a role in the apparent abductions of Sherrill Levitt, 47, her daughter Suzie Streeter, 19, and Streeter's classmate, Stacy McCall, 18.

Investigators will not say if the fugitive knew any of the missing women. But police sources said one of the other suspected vandals is a former boyfriend
