President's Report

Coming back into the Chairperson's role this season after three years I noticed many improvements around the Centre. I commend Bradley Edwards as Chairperson for the past three years, and the other members of the past three Executive Committees for the progress that has been made, notably in terms of the equipment and sound financial position of the Centre. I would like to thank the 2010/11 Committee for their efforts this season. In particular I would like to acknowledge Glenis Folk for taking on the Canteen Manager's role five days before opening day. The canteen is a vital area of fundraising for the Centre, covering the bulk of the cost of trophies and medallions.

The key positions of Secretary/Executive Officer, Championships Officer and Officer of Officials were all vacant for the season. This created a considerable workload and although we managed it is not conducive to achieving worthwhile goals. Most time and effort is spent on day to day tasks rather than forward planning, which is potentially detrimental to the Centre in the longer term. Many areas for improvement, particularly where extra help is required, were identified in special events such as the Christmas Gift, 1500 Invitational and Championships and can be addressed next season.

I was pleased with the response to State Relays this year. The "whole of centre" approach was well supported and hopefully can be built on in future years. As well as being a great social occasion, relays is an opportunity for the kids to be part of a team and has the potential to build and maintain a sense of unity in the Centre. Some practices need refinement to make the event more successful next season, and hopefully we will be able to address those earlier next season. Coach identification and training is important to this endeavour and hopefully we can get some additional new coaches next year. This would reduce the workload on Tim Blake who coached several teams, and also give the teams the benefit of more "one-on-one" coaching.



As always, when there are a large number of people in one place there will be some disagreements. It is impossible to keep three hundred people happy all the time. It is too easy to be pessimistic and dwell on these issues, and while it is said that "the squeaky wheel gets the grease" we must be mindful that the majority seemed satisfied with the season. They are the families we need to manage the Centre for. Overall I thought the programs ran reasonably well, and with poor support at State level putting the future of the PB Challenge in

jeopardy we should look at an eighteen week season in 2011/12, finishing Championships before Zones. The "Lucky \$50 note" raffle has become a constant irritation between Clubs and Centre. For the effort required to raise \$250 it is probably time to look at alternative fundraising ventures. Hosting Winter Cross Country competition provides a regular fundraising opportunity, as does the Rotary markets at Belmont Forum. Targeted fundraising for specific items is possibly going to be better supported throughout the Centre. I firmly believe we should be working with the Belmont City Council towards a venue capable of hosting Zones.

It is noticeable that much of the correspondence is now done by email and I am concerned that this reduces the personal contact between people at the Centre and leads to a substantial amount of unnecessary communications. One of the significant benefits of sport is the social aspect and this is diminished by emails instead of personal contact. With this in mind we held a sun-downer for Officials in October with Frank Bertoli from LAWA as a guest speaker. The aim being to create



a network providing Officials the opportunity to discuss officiating with similarly minded people, and also encouraging parents to become Officials. Thirteen officials attended and put forward some great ideas for future consideration. A significant suggestion was the need for a path of development for Key Officials, and finding ways for them to develop their skills without pigeon-holing them into one role for the entire season.

From this I have proposed a roster of positions between Clubs. The aim is to provide variety and fill some of the Centre's key roles by providing the opportunity for rotating people through various sites and areas of the Centre, under the supervision of Executive or Non-Executive Officers, in an attempt to identify people who may be willing to take on more responsibility at Centre level. It is important that the Centre has some form of succession planning in place. The fear of people being taken out of their comfort zone for an entire season to take on a position they know little about is quite daunting, so if we can offer the opportunity to see how various areas of the Centre work this may reduce that fear.

I do notice that the atmosphere at Belmont has changed, possibly due to the moving on of some of the long term families and the subsequent removal of some of the innate knowledge they brought to the Centre. Of concern was the amount of time Club Managers were required to spend on site instead of managing their club areas. Perhaps this contributes to other issues. There are many willing helpers at the Centre, but without direction their efforts are to a certain extent wasted. This issue must be addressed in order to make operations at competition meeting days at Club and Centre levels as organised as is possible. At one point I was told that because clubs had representation on the Belmont Centre Executive they did not need to appoint Delegates, demonstrating a lack of understanding of the roles of Delegates. One idea for consideration next season is to have a seminar for key Club and Centre personnel before the season commences to share information and get Clubs and Centre working towards clearly defined common goals. Further to this I would like to work towards the Arena Manager chairing Club Managers meetings so the content can be entirely focussed on Centre competition issues. We should be concentrating on the objective of developing and preparing confident athletes and officials for State Championships over the six months of the season.

In the next couple of years we may face some uncertainty or disruption with regards to the upgraded intersection at Leach Highway and Abernethy Road as part of the Perth Gateway project. We were advised that capital projects such as improved lighting, grandstand extensions and permanent shades cannot proceed until more information is available. The impact on us is yet to be determined but I am hopeful that it could also provide the opportunity for significant development of the Gerry Archer track.

In closing I would like to again thank the families who have contributed in every way possible to their children's athletics in 2010/11. I hope that many will return next year.

Treasurer's Report

Financially, the centre ended the year well above the expected forecast profit. With over 100 more registrations than last season, the flow on effect on income is noticeable. Thanks to Bradley, we were also able to secure a grant from the Department of Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs (FAHCSIA) for \$5000.00.

FINANCIAL POSITION: As at the end of the season there is over \$43000 in the bank and a net income of \$16365.45. This is compared to last season's net income of \$4334.00. Along with the registrations, grant and canteen profits, we also got the full benefit of having surplus funds in a high interest account, which earned around \$110.00 on average in interest each month.

CANTEEN: I would like to thank Glenis Folk for filling in at the last minute to run the canteen for the season. A profit of over \$5200 well exceeded the budget forecast and was up from the \$3700 raised last year.



FUNDRAISING: The Christmas gift raffle raised \$236.10. All clubs ran their lucky \$50.00 note raffle on behalf of the centre and \$250.00 was raised there. All funds raised goes towards the purchase of new equipment. Unfortunately, we were not able to run the Belmont Rotary Markets this year, which usually raises around \$1500.00. \$530.00 was raised on behalf of Princess Margaret Hospital and those funds were forwarded on to WALA to present on our behalf.

SPONSORSHIPS AND DONATIONS: I would like to thank Power Industrial Supplies who has once again sponsored the popular Tiny Tots races, and Jim Farr for his \$100 donation to the centre.

FAHCSIA GRANT: This grant was applied to upgrade the PA system, purchase an air compressor for the trolley wheels, purchase an esky and trolley for officials' water and for funds to help with the cost of erecting permanent shade shelters on the arena. All have been purchased with the exception of the shelters, as they are now not able to be erected until the outcome of the Gateway Project is known. Alternate usage options for the funds will be applied for with FAHSCIA to satisfy the grant conditions.

PURCHASES AND EXPENSES: Some of the other new equipment that was purchased this year include a long jump mat, new 100m metal tape measure, walks bibs and light coloured discuses for twilight meets. There were some new ideas that were put in place this year and will need to be budgeted for in the future. The purchase of water for officials on site only commenced midway into the season and proved popular. Catering costs increased this year as there were a couple of functions held during the season that have not been held before. One was a sausage sizzle for athletes competing in the relays competition and the other was an information evening for officials. It is hoped that these types of functions will continue next season.

All in all, the centre is in a good financial position. This helps to ensure that when equipment is in need of replacement, we are in a position to be able to purchase most things as needed.

Registrar's Report

Records and Ranking Officer's Report

As my first year as Records and Rankings Officer for Belmont Little Athletics Centre I have found it both challenging and rewarding and I plan to renominate for the position for season 2011-2012. Without the assistance of Christine Christie (ex Kalamunda/Lesmurdie LAC parent and the previous Records and Rankings Officer) and Bradley Edwards, President Kewdale LAC it would have been more difficult to perform the job and I would like to offer a thank you for their assistance.

NEW EVENTS:

No new events were introduced for the 2010-2011 season.

RECORDS:

At the beginning of the season all current weights for field events were reviewed by the Chief Field Judge, Catherine Geneste and records were rectified for the following events:

- Under 6 and 7 girls' shot put – the correct weight 1 kg was recognised.
- Under 14 and 15 girls' discus – the correct weight 1 kg was recognised.
- Under 16 and 17 girls' shot put – the correct weight 4 kg was recognised , no record for the under 17 girls' shot put for centre championships was awarded.
- The under 15 girls' shot put record was rescinded from the previous year as the weight has not changed.
- Under 16 and 17 boys javelin – the correct weight 700 gms was recognised, however no record was awarded for the under 16's as there were no 16 boys registered for 2010-2011 and no record was awarded for centre championships for the under 17 boys.

Any missing inaugural records will be awarded in the coming seasons for the under 16 boys javelin, under 17 boys Centre Championship javelin and under 17 girls shot put.

During the season there was only one field event record missed, however there were several short track records missed during the regular season and at Centre Championships.

Throughout the season there were 46 records, of them 14 were inaugural. There were 4 open records 3 of these were inaugural.

Publicity Officer's Report

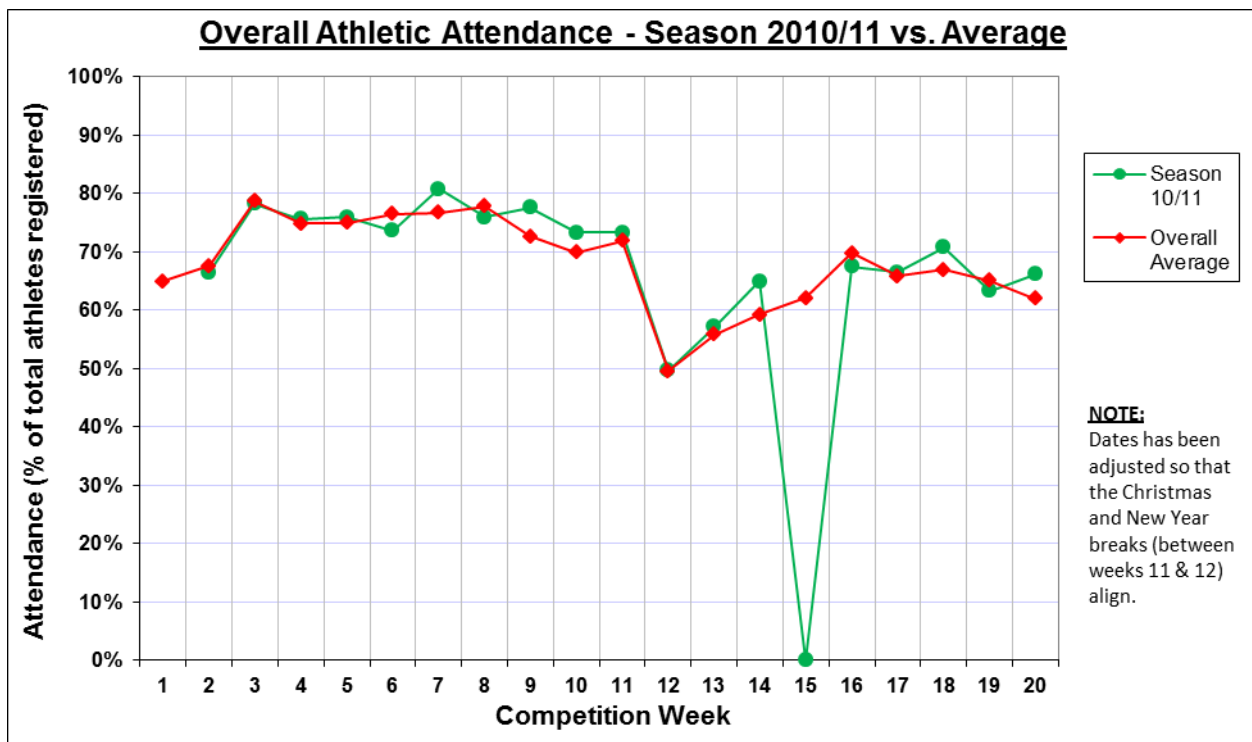
I would firstly like to thank all of the BLAC Committee for their help and support throughout the season. Not only does it make it so much easier to fulfil your own role within the Centre, but it makes light work of the other vacant positions as well. The Centre has been lucky over the last few seasons to have had a great group of parents willing to step up to the Executive Committee, and I hope to see a number of new faces step forward this season to ensure the hard work already completed is not wasted.

The season was off to a great start with the Yearbooks ready on time and with improved content. Thanks again to Burswood Advertising for publishing our Yearbook and to all the advertisers for supporting us through the Yearbook.

Opening Day was again well supported by our Life Members, special guests and LAWA Board of Management representatives. The day saw over 200 athletes come down to help celebrate the start of the season and compete in the "Come & Try" day.

The March Past was won by the High Wycombe Club which did well having grown from 15 athletes last season to 71 this season. Overall the Centre had over a 20% increase in registrations this season, which was a great effort. The Commonwealth Games were held in Delhi around the start of the season, which would have helped achieve this increase as well.

The season overall went well. Our attendance percentage matched those of previous seasons and even bucked the trend by increasing on the final day of competition. Week 14 (shown as week 15 because of the staggered start) was unfortunately washed out due to a big storm that flooded the track with only 20 minutes of rain, and so that is why that week shows as 0% attendance.



Unfortunately, while Belmont had its largest number of athletes nominated for the Personal Best Challenge this season, the event was cancelled due to a number of larger Centres withdrawing due to a lack of their athletes attending. LAWA has indicated that this event will no longer be run and will be dropped from the season calendar.



Although only one team came away with a medal at the State relay Championships, it was still a success due to the large number of teams that represented Belmont. We had a representative team in nearly every age group and gender for the track relays. Each team competed to the best of their ability on the day with some reserve runners stepping up to other age groups to ensure that the Centre could field all teams on the day.

The Christmas Gift was a success with athletes running the finals in the middle of the evening in front of cheering athletes and parents in the stands. Santa's visit was once again a challenging event, with it being an ongoing struggle to control the excited athletes who all wanted to go out to see him at the same time. Thanks to the many parents who assisted with "crowd control".

It was also a positive for the 1500m Invitational, which this season attracted close to forty visiting athletes from a dozen different Centres, some as far as Yanchep. The event went very well with the use of walks bibs and a parent official counting the athletes laps as they went around. The issuing of separate sets of medals for visiting athletes and Belmont athletes was also a great improvement over last season and should hopefully see more visiting athletes next season.

The procedures and guidelines for both of these special events are now well documented, tried and tested, so there should be no confusion or issues arising when they are run in the future.



While the Centre was offered an opportunity to fundraise through the Belmont Rotary Markets again this season, the month allocated was February, and with Multi Event Championships and Zones falling within that month the offer was politely declined. We were however successful in securing November 2011 for this fundraising event. I would encourage any future BLAC Committee to apply for this fundraising opportunity as it requires no outlay of funds, can be completed by an adult and a child, and requires no special skills or effort.

It should come as no surprise that fundraising activities such as these are a necessity for the long term survival and improvement of the Centre. The Centre will be hosting a Winter Cross Country event in May, 2011. This should be considered another fundraising activity and not simply a competition meet. The Centre needs to grasp every opportunity it can to ensure its continued success.

We were lucky enough to be awarded a Volunteers Grant from the Department of Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs (FHCSIA). The grant of \$5000 was to enable the Centre to replace and upgrade our old P.A. System (\$800), provide an esky and trolley to enable water to be taken out for Officials (\$300), purchase a 240V pump to inflate our now over 60 trolley tyres (\$200) and to part finance permanent shade shelters (\$3700).

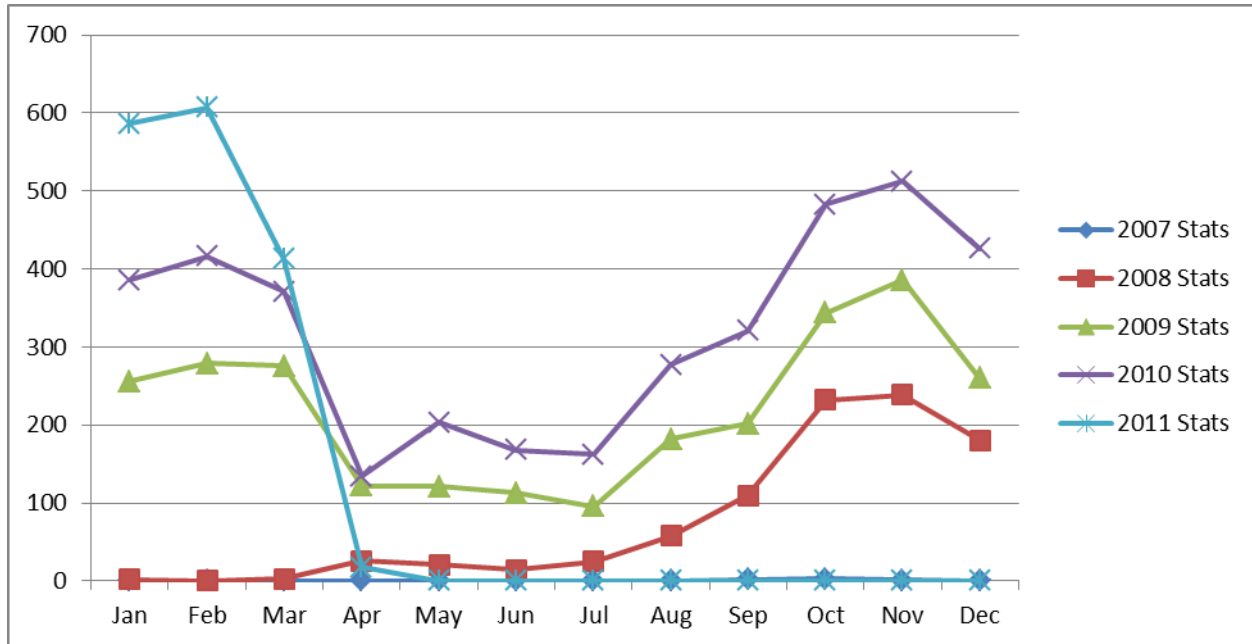
Unfortunately, the permanent shade shelters have been put on hold until the impact of the Gateway Project on Gerry Archer can be assessed. The Gateway Project will see the Abernathy Road/Leach Highway intersection become an overpass, and the extent of the land required for the on/off ramps may impact on the track location and orientation.

This season's Centre Championships went quite smoothly except for a couple of issues which were related to athlete eligibility for events. This is unfortunately not a new issue, and while all efforts are made each season to provide athletes and Clubs with information prior to Centre Championships, it is always left to the last minute by parents to sort out. Clubs must take more responsibility for informing their members of the rules for Centre Championships eligibility in



relation to competing in an event at least three times and also in relation to providing a medical certificate at the time of illness or injury – not just before Centre Championships.

The website was once again a key benefit in allowing the majority of athletes to check their eligibility for events and also to track their progress throughout the season. This season has seen the continued and consistent growth in website usage. The new website design implemented in January should ensure a simpler and cleaner interface for athletes, parents, clubs and committee.

The newly minted Centre Championships medallions were again popular. This season the inscription was changed to “Est. 1970”. With this change they can now be used for coming seasons as the standard for all Centre Championships. Special Events like the Christmas Gift and 1500m Invitational should continue to use “off the shelf” medals with Centre inserts to ensure that these minted medallions remain as something special for the Centre Championships. WA Trophies still holds a considerable stock of Belmont Little Athletics medallion centres for for this purpose.



I would also like to thank **Power Industrial Supplies** for their continued support of our Tiny Tots race. It remains a very popular event with all of our young aspiring athletes as well as the parents who enjoy watching them.

The Centre Closing Day finished off the season in style with our only U17 girl singing the national anthem for the many visitors, parents and athletes to get us underway. It was a splendid rendition by Vincion Geneste to finish off her 11 years of Little Athletics at the Belmont Centre.

Chief Field Umpire's Report

Borrowing the collection of past Belmont Yearbooks at the beginning of the season allowed me to determine that several weight changes had taken place over the years for various implements. Unfortunately our yearbooks do not accommodate for the weight of the implements in the records section, so it is understandable why the oversights have occurred.



In previous seasons when Executive Committee members had noticed an error with the weight used in a past season compared to the current, a precedent was set, which is as follows: Whatever the age group, gender or event – it would be recognised that from the beginning of that season as an inaugural record, providing that it was confirmed by the Chief Field Umpire or one of the Executive Committee members with the approved official tape measure.

This precedent was applied to the following events this season due to the weight changes not being acknowledged in previous seasons;

SHOT PUT

- FB Girls weight changed season 2006/2007 from 1.5kg to 1.0kg
- U7 Girls weight changed season 2006/2007 from 1.5kg to 1.0kg

NB: Along with the 2010/2011 Records and Ranking Officer (Cheryl Short), I went through the Centre record books to validate the changes prior to the introduction of the inaugural records this season.

There was one oversight made from a previous season - the record for the U15 girls Shot Put always been for 3kgs and therefore belongs to C.Palmer who attained 13.92m in 1986 for the Centre record and 13.56m 1986 in the Championship record. The only conclusion I can think of for this error was the change of weight of the U16 and U17 girls' shot put and the U15 girls was mistaken amongst it.

Although I tried not to miss any records there was one I overlooked during Centre Championships due to an oversight on my part at the beginning of the season. Overall I hope that all the field records are now up to date.

One advantage of being able to move between multiple sites for potential records was the opportunity for Key Officials who were new to a site to ask me questions about their event and how to run their site. I noted that as the season progressed so did their confidence, this was prevalent through the consistency of their calls.

Equipment Officers Report

Firstly, thanks to all Clubs for assisting on setup and pack up days throughout the season. For the most part these went pretty smoothly and were normally well attended. This allowed the competition to start on time most days.

In general the majority of equipment was well treated, but the temporary shade tents continue to be damaged by over eager parents who just want to get home as soon as possible. With each 3m by 3m shade tent costing the centre around \$250, this has the potential to be an expensive issue for the Centre.

Luckily the two times that they have been broken thus far, the spare parts have been cheaply sourced and the repairs completed within the week. However, not to have to repair the shades at all should be the goal.

Additionally, tent pegs again seem to be a concern with many of them going missing over the course of the season. This obviously raises issues with them being caught in the council mowers and causing damage to them, as well as being an ongoing and un-necessary cost for the Centre.



There were some additional purchases this season with extra field markers purchased so that we can have bigger groups of athletes on field sites, light coloured discuses so that we can improve safety during twilights and extra walks bibs to enable different age groups to be run together and reduce the time required to run these races.

Thanks to Jim Farr who has continued to assist me throughout the season and who has put up his hand to assist with equipment upgrades and improvements over the course of the winter months. Some of these include;

- Repainting of all field markers.
- Installation of shelving in the shed.
- Construction of a new hurdle trolley.
- Improvements to the site trolleys.
- Marking of tent pegs to make locating them easier.

I believe the Belmont Centre is at a stage now where we have the majority of equipment that we require to conduct our weekly competition meets. It is now more an issue of replacing old and damaged equipment for new equipment. The first, and unfortunately the most expensive of these, should be the high jump mats. At a cost of around \$7000 a set, this would be a substantial investment by the Centre, but one which is long overdue. I would encourage the Centre to fundraise for this as a specific project until the Gateway Project is completed and funds are required for other projects.

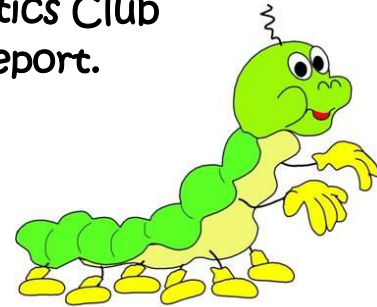

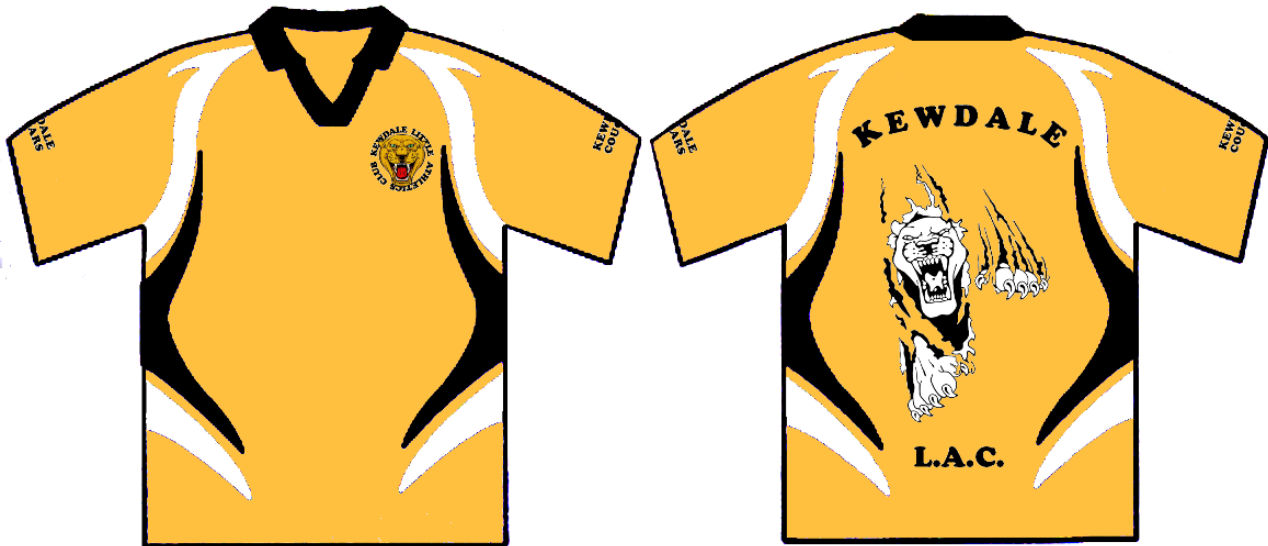

I have reconciled the number of registration from the various clubs with the number registered paid to the association.


From this sampling, I have found that the figures and information are accurate and true record of the financial transaction for the receipt and expenditure of the club.
