They combed Lake Springfield northwest on the James River and along Person Creek.

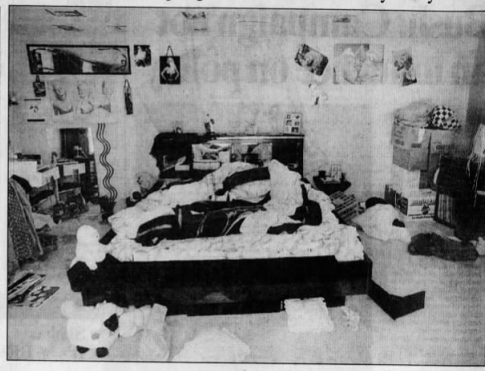
